Survey of Cesarean Section on Request

(conducted at 5th Singapore O&G Congress, Sheraton Towers, Singapore)

A survey was undertaken of those attending the debate on cesarean sections (CS) on maternal request on 9 September 2005. An interactive audience poll after the debate revealed that majority were not in favour that *all* cesarean sections on maternal request be allowed. However in the survey, the majority allowed CS on maternal request for specific indications, the most common being fear of labour & pain and the second most common was social convenience (astrological, patient or husband's request).

Results:

Audience Poll Question (51 responses from doctors/nurses in the forum)

4b. Did you lose your patient before because you refuse non-medically indicated CS?

Yes: 1 (7.1)% No: 12 (85.7)% Blank:1 (7.1%)
